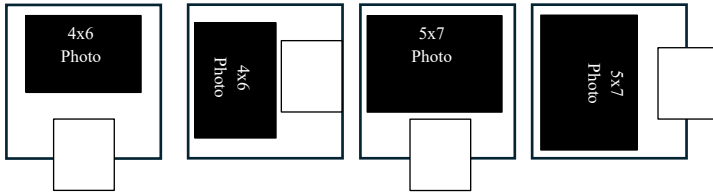
1. Each entry is one photo, 4x6 or 5x7 only.
2. All entries are to be color photos, unless specified.
3. Photo and entry tag must be securely and neatly mounted on an 8”x8” square of BLACK cardstock. Due to the humidity rubber cement or photo mounting squares are recommended for photo mounting and stapler for entry card.
4. Photos may not be matted or framed.
5. Entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
6. Photos previously entered at the Monroe County Fair may not be entered again, including calendars.
7. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry per lot number.
8. Unless specifically stated, humans and/or animals may or may not be included in the photo. Example: Seasonal photos may include animals but is not necessary.
9. In every case, quality of the photo will be the primary consideration in judging, taking into account such things as focus, composition, lighting, etc. If photo entries are equal in

quality, top prizes will be awarded to those which are most neatly exhibited.

10. Entries that are not in compliance with the fair book will be dropped one placing.

11. Age qualified amateurs who choose to enter both photo departments 120 and 220 may not use the same photo twice.

All photos must be the same size, with the size being no larger than 5x7. Photos used in a series may not be used in a different lot number.
